FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – January 2026

From January 1, 2026, through January 31, 2026, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 95%. The save rate for dogs was 92% and for cats it was 99%.*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- 69 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 12 dogs and 2 cats were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- One puppy died in kennel from severe illness.
- One puppy was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries.
- Four dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public.
- One dog was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries.
- One dog was humanely euthanized as part of head to lab bite investigations.

Cats:

- One kitten was humanely euthanized in shelter due to severe injury.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

*Best Friends Community Dashboard formula: [(Live Intakes, including Owner Requested Euthanasia)-(Died in Care)-(Lost in Care)-(Shelter Euthanasia)-(Owner Requested Euthanasia)] divided by Live Intakes
