FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – January 2025

From January 1, 2025 through January 31, 2025, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 88% and for cats it was 96%.*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- 61 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- · 7 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- · One neonatal puppy died in care failure to thrive
- One dog died in care due to severe illness
- · Three dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe injury or illness
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized as part of bite investigations
- · One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of their owner as part of a bite investigation

Cats:

- · Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
- · Two cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness
