FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – April 2025

From April 1, 2025 through April 30, 2025, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 93% and for cats it was 92%.*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- 80 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 13 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- One dog was humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
- Three dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public
- One dog was humanely euthanized as part of a head-to-lab bite investigation

Cats:

- Five neonatal kittens died in foster due to failure to thrive
- Two neonatal kittens died in shelter due to failure to thrive
- Three kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
- Four cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
