## FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – May 2025

From May 1, 2025 through May 31, 2025, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 94% and for cats it was 91%.\*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- · 88 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 4 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

## Dogs:

- One dog died in kennel post-surgery.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public
- · One dog was humanely euthanized as part of a head-to-lab bite investigation

## Cats:

- · Seven neonatal kittens died in foster due to failure to thrive
- One kitten died en route to the shelter.
- · Three kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
- One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury

\* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
