FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – June 2025

From June 1, 2025 through June 30, 2025, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 93%. The save rate for dogs was 92% and for cats it was 93%.*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- 72 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 13 dogs and 1 cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- One dog died in foster care.
- Four dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized as part of a head-to-lab bite investigation.

Cats:

- Two neonatal kittens died in shelter due to unknown causes.
- Two newborn kittens died en route to the shelter.
- Two cats died during surgery.
- Three kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury.
- Two cats was humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
