FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – August

From August 1, 2025 through August 31, 2025, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 91%. The save rate for dogs was 85% and for cats it was 95%.*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- 54 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 13 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- · One dog died en route to the shelter.
- Four puppies died in shelter from illness/injury.
- One dog was humanely euthanized as part of a head to lab bite investigation.
- · Six dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public.
- Three dogs were humanely euthanized due to illness/injury.

Cats:

- · One neonatal kitten died in foster failure to thrive.
- · Two kittens died in shelter due to unknown causes.
- · One cat died in shelter due to unknown causes.
- · Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury.

Our dedicated staff would like to thank all our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
